Unfortunately, we had to cancel the Raku Firing Workshop in April, due to a number of issues.

The Raku firing will now be held in August at a date to be determined. Can members please note that any piece they would like to have fired at the Raku workshop needs to be made out of RAKU CLAY, white preferably.

Anyone wishing to add horse hair, feathers or other decorative embellishments, your pots need to be burnished [smoothed, shiny] for the best effect.

Pots that are Raku fired are NOT waterproof and are decorative only.

More to come on Raku Workshop as be approach August.

We have entered the Free Choice section. With this being the club 50th year, it would be great to incorporate this into our display.


