The Time Capsule opening will be on 19th October 2024. This will include life membership recognition and a dinner.


Sue Creed has proposed that a mini market occur at the clubhouse on the day, Sue has worked on a book to celebrate the Club's 50th Anniversary.

HOUSEKEEPING


It has come to our attention that the back area and the kiln shed flooring, are being used to glaze pieces as there is a glaze pattern left on the floor. The tables directly outside of the kiln shed are designated for this purpose as the bench tops were thus constructed so members had room for glazing and it would make it easier to clean up when finished. Also glaze has been spilt on the cement and not cleaned off. There is a hose just around the corner to wash off excess and/or spilt glaze if not wanting to complete this task by hand.

Also, it has been noted that the blackboard within the club house has been used as a art board and this is definitely not to be utilized for this purpose. The purpose of the

blackboard is to relay information and leave messages for other members of the potters club.

Just a reminder to please clean up your area in the club house when you have finished on the wheel or on the tables. The members coming after you have to clean up before they can commence creating.

This experience bonded us as a family with lots of laughs, creativity and friendly banter. I thoroughly enjoy being part of our potting community. Not only has my confidence and skills grown but the friendships I have discovered within the club are truly delightful.

O PRINTOR MIN

Within the Warwick Potters, I have held different positions, regularly been the Show Coordinator for 6 years, 2 years as soup night coordinator, the Facebook creator in 2013, secretary on and off for 10 years, assisted with markets and taught beginner classes for years. I regularly contribute my time and resources to make the Warwick Potters a happy and successful place for all members.





Artistically, I am very inventive and love to learn, I really enjoy workshops and try to attend as many as possible. I like to produce pieces that are fun and different. Although, I paint wheel pottery, I seemed to be drawn to hand sculpture, in particular, animals and scenes. I create unique pieces

that are as much an experiment as a learning product. As a painter I prefer to underglaze than glaze and most of my pieces are a raku generally fired to either an 1140 or a 1220 firing. (This lower firing allows the underglaze to set without burning out.) Terracotta works well with my garden pieces firing with underglaze and a clear glaze that fires from 1000 to 1280 degrees. I love that stuff.



I recently acquired my own large kiln and I am having so much fun working out my processes. I will continue my clay journey for many years to come... Watch this space!
