QUIRKY INSPIRATION



FEATURE POTTER – RAY TAINTON

It was an absolute pleasure to chat to Ray in respect to his journey with Pottery. Ray was kind enough to share his wonderful odyssey with us.

"I have been potting in Warwick since 1980 and began my journey in 1965 when given years 45 Year 7 boys to begin an art/craft lesson once a week in Townsville. We needed clay to begin teaching pottery and the clay I purchased came from a quarry near Stuart Jail.

I married in 1969 and gained an interest in potting for myself. This gave me a chance to meet other people, have a weekend at the coast and something to do outside of education.

In the Warwick Pottery Club I have held most positions. I was noted for badges, coffee mugs and soup bowls. The most beer mugs I did was for an order of 500. Soup bowls made must have been into the thousands, some too big, some too small and others just right.

Since retirement I have not taken on any positions and have dropped all clubs except one, being Warwick Potters Inc. I have enjoyed my time with pottery clubs but now leave that to the running by others.

I have four kilns operating and only ever take the electric kilns to 1100c as nicrochrome wire does not like stoneware and burns out easily. One of my kilns was a salt glazed kiln which I have fired up for the Warwick Club, built at Betty Prendgest's property. We had many enjoyable raku firing days when we were situated at P.G.C. Science Room.

Many weekends were taken up with tutoring at Bundaberg, Munduberra, Childers, Maryborough, Hervey Bay, Gympie, Kingaroy, Murgon, Yarraman, Roma, Goondawindi and Warwick. I was invited as assistant tutor with John Gilbert at Mt.Gravatt Summer School and with Noel Flood at Toowoomba USQ and several weekends with Merv Feeney. I remember well gong to Buderim Club for a weekend to build a raku kiln and began raku firing form 10am until 9pm at night. Huge day!!

1978 saw me featured in two TV Channel 8 segments on Ative 8 programme for the Arts led by John Sinclair, Farm Fest Toowoomba. The topic was kilns and firing glaze held in Maryborough.

1984 saw me win first prize using ARC weldmesh in a competition in kiln making. Merv Feeney used my innovation when building two 13 ton kilns to fire flower pots.

In 1985 I was proud to accept Life Membership of the Wide Bay Burnett Potters Association. In 2008 I accepted the position of Patron of WBBPA.

On October 19th I will proudly be awarded the position of Life Membership of the Warwick Potters Inc. and I know others are planned to receive an award also."
